

Pupil Premium Spending 2014- 15

In the Financial Year 2014-15 we were funded for:

- 14 pupils who received Free School Meals Premium
- 2 pupils classed as Looked After
- 31 pupils from a Service Premium
- Total Allocated: £31 622

Spending in the academic year 2014-15

Item	Cost	Impact
Teaching Assistants to lead Intervention groups	£ 12,200	See impact on pupil progress below
First Class@maths training and intervention support for children in Y3	£2250	There have been three groups of children that have taken part over the year. The intervention had a marked impact on confidence and the children's willingness to answer questions in lessons. All children improved their assessment scores from the beginning to the end of the intervention and the teachers have commented on an increased engagement in lessons.

Specialist equipment for a Y4 pupil	£500	The child is able to access work more easily and therefore is making progress.
EMS support for a Y4 pupil	£2700	This enabled learning to continue while this child was working away from school for a period of time and supported the child through a difficult time.
Home-School link worker	£1200	The Home -School link worker has had a direct impact on a number of families with pupil premium children. This has led to situations being resolved or regular support given to parents that has enabled the learning of children to continue in school.
Able writers day	£175	The more able Y2 Pupil Premium children were able to work with an author and other more able children from local schools to produce high quality writing.
WWII Service transport for Service children	£50	The service children in KS2 were able to attend and take part in a special church service at Ripon Cathedral with other service children from the local area.
Teaching assistant in class support	£4160	Extra support has been given in class to support those children on pupil premium.
Development of a Parent Support room	£2386	A room has been created in school for meetings with parents. This has been used by staff to hold extended parent consultations and by the Home School link worker to meet with parents who need support.
Handwriting scheme	£691	This has been purchased and will be introduced across school to support all children, but particularly pupil premium children with improving their handwriting.
SENCO release time for EMS work with specific Pupil Premium children and AFL assessment	£1320	This has enabled the SENCO to support both parents and children and liaise more closely with support services to enable more effective support to be provided.
Pupil Tracking Software	£850	This will enable the progress of Pupil Premium children to be tracked more closely following the introduction of the new assessment framework.

Impact on Pupil Progress

The measurement of assessment has changed during the year. Those in Y2 and Y6 were assessed using levels. Those in the other year groups were assessed using the new year group expectations.

In Reception the one disadvantaged child achieved a good level of development. One out of 4 Service children achieved a good level of development.

All Year 1 and Year 2 children receiving Pupil Premium achieved national expectations.

KS2 Children

In reading 7 out of the 9 disadvantaged children achieved national expectations or above for their year group. The year 6 child, although not reaching National Expectations, made two levels of progress through KS2.

In writing 3 out of the 9 disadvantaged children reached national expectations although once again the year 6 child, although not reaching National Expectations, made two levels of progress through KS2.

In maths 7 out of the 9 disadvantaged children achieved national expectations or above for their year.

For the Service pupils in KS2

In reading 8 out of 12 achieved National Expectations or above for their year group

In writing 7 out of 12 achieved National Expectations or above for their year group

In maths 9 out of the 12 achieved National Expectations or above for their year group
