Impact on Pupil Progress

All Reception children receiving Pupil Premium achieved a Good Level of Development at the end of their first year in school.

In reading 31 of the Pupil Premium children achieved their target level or above with all but four of those who were below the national expectations closing the gap between their result and the national.

In writing 35 of the Pupil Premium children achieved their target level or above with all but six of those who were below the national expectations closing the gap between their result and the national.

In maths 31 of the Pupil Premium children achieved their target level or above with all but two of those who were below the national expectations closing the gap between their results and the national.

The Head Teacher, Senior Leadership, all teaching staff and the Home-School Link worker maintain an on- going programme of support for Pupil Premium pupils, which is subject to the oversight of the Governors' Finance and School Development Committees.
