Read and notice unusual correspondence between grapheme and phoneme	Talk about favourite words and phrases.	Begin to use some of the diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join letters	Use full stops, capital letters , exclamation and question marks accurately to demarcate sentences and commas for lists	Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10x multiplication tables	
Read most words quickly and accurately when they have been frequently encountered without overt sounding and blending	Increase repertoire of poems learnt by heart, appreciating these and reciting some, with appropriate intonation to make the meaning clear	Understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are best left unjoined	Use a capital letter for names of people, places, the days of the week, and the personal pronoun 'I'	Add and subtract: two 1-digit; 2-digit and a 1 digit; 2-digit and 10s; two 2-digit and three 1-digit numbers	
Read aloud books closely matched to their improving phonic knowledge, sounding out unfamiliar words accurately, automatically and without undue hesitation	Answer and ask appropriate questions and make predictions on the basis of what has been read so far	Write capital letters and digits of the correct size, with correct orientation and relationship to one another and to lower case letters	Use subordination (using <i>when, if, that, or because</i> ) and co-ordination (using <i>or, and, or but</i> )	Solve problems with addition and subtraction
